Nicki Minaj: "I love you, butt. That's it. Butt."


Left Shark: "I may be the left shark, but you are the right shark for me."


4. Pick a good CD for the drive to the restaurant. Johnny's got this one in the bag. He knows women. And women love piano music. Johnny likes
